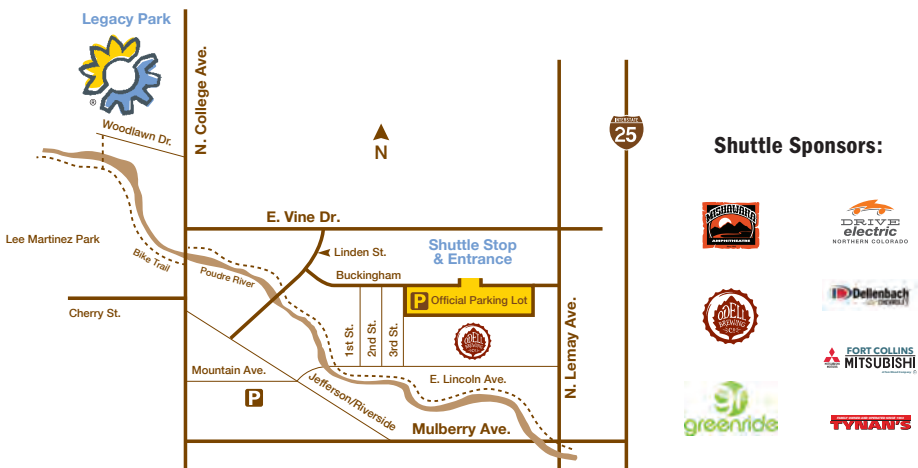
Transportation and Parking Options

Ride the Bio-Bus

NEW PARKING LOT for 2014! We have a 12-acre lot just north of Odell Brewing that will be available to ALL fair-goers this year. A FREE shuttle bus will run every 15 minutes to-and-from the Fair both days, compliments of the Mishawaka Event Bus, and Green Ride Colorado. We encourage EVERYONE to park here all day both days. 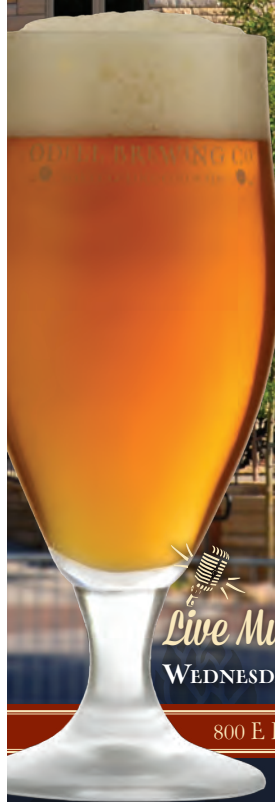

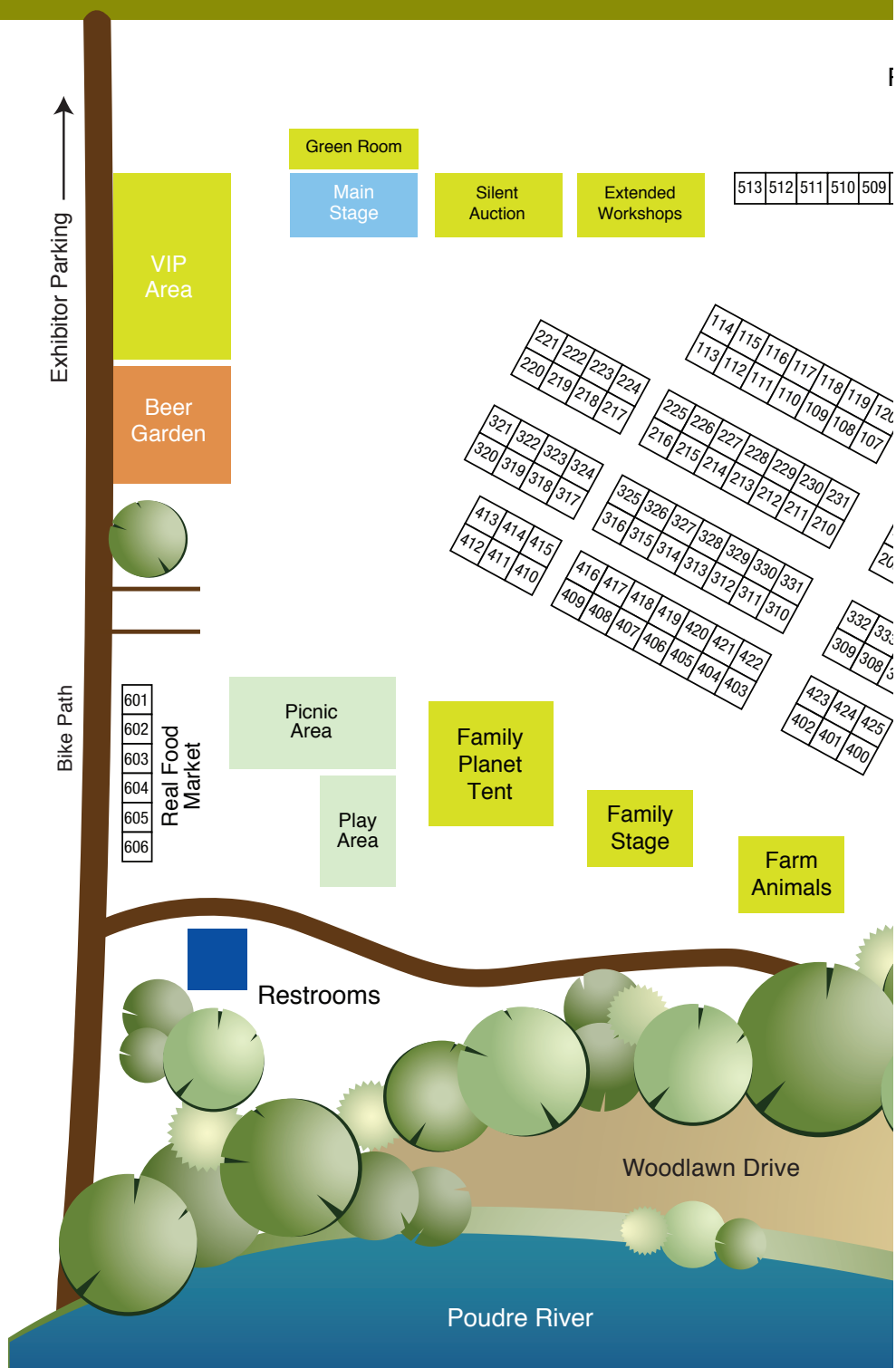

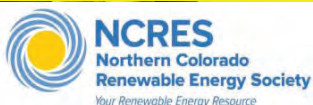
